



The International Press Delegation (IPD) represents the global media and serves as the journalistic body of the conference. Members of the IPD cover committee sessions, interview delegates, and publish articles, press releases, and sometimes satirical pieces that reflect the debates and negotiations taking place. This committee gives participants a unique perspective, allowing them to influence the flow of debate by shaping narratives, highlighting key issues, and holding delegates accountable through public reporting. By simulating the role of international media in diplomacy, the IPD adds realism, transparency, and dynamic interaction to AZMUN, while giving its members experience in political journalism, analysis, and communication.

Represented Outlets:

Associated Press (USA/EE.UU.): The Associated Press covers breaking news across politics, business, sports, and culture with a global reach with comprehensive domestic and international news reporting, and one of the most relied upon source.

Reuters (UK/Reino Unido): Reuters focuses on international news, financial markets, business trends, and political developments worldwide without choosing sides as it has a strong reputation in neutrality and covers sources of multiple different markets from business to technology and politics.

BBC (UK/Reino Unido): The BBC reports on UK events while offering extensive coverage of global politics, science, culture, and society. Its analysis strength makes it one of the most recognized sources in the world.

The New York Times (USA/EE.UU.): The New York Times, an investigative journal, provides in-depth reporting on U.S. politics, world affairs, business, culture, and opinion, and combines facts and people's comments to create pieces both nationally and internationally.

Clarín (Argentina): As one of Argentina's largest daily newspapers, Clarín emphasizes Argentine politics, economy, sports, and culture, with additional coverage of Latin American news.

Folha de S.Paulo (Brazil/Brasil): Like Clarín, the developments of Folha de S.Paulo focuses on Brazilian specific news such as politics, economics, and other topics, and ranges to cover international Latin American news as well.

Le Monde (France/Francia): French political topics are widely covered in this news source, such as European integration, international relations, and even cultural affairs, while its intellectual and analytical approach makes it one of the most popular news sources of France.

Süddeutsche Zeitung (Germany/Alemania): Unlike some of the previous sources, Süddeutsche Zeitung tends to have a more left-leaning editorial like focus with emphasis on German politics including positions in international affairs, while also covering regional topics like economy and business.

Sunday Times (South Africa/Sudáfrica): The Sunday Times highlights South African politics, economy, society, and broader African development, while bringing in perspectives like that of investigative journalism and covering other significant events that affect the region.

Daily Nation (Kenya/Kenia): Along with East African regional affairs, Daily Nation also focuses on Kenyan politics, development, society, and economic news..

The Jerusalem Post (Israel): The Jerusalem Post emphasizes Israeli politics and Middle Eastern affair and makes itself a central source of Jewish issues worldwide.

The Sydney Morning Herald (Australia): The Sydney Morning Herald contains a focus on Asia-Pacific issues whilst covering more specifically regional topics, such as Australian politics and business.

RT (Russia/Rusia): RT utilizes a Russian perspective and tends to counter Western opinions and other areas of discussion and remains heavily focussed on domestic Russian politics.

The Times of India (India): The wide readership of Times of India make it one of the most influential sources of Indian politics, economy, culture, and South Asian regional affairs, and it has a drastic effect on shaping public opinion.

Al Jazeera (Qatar/Catar): Al Jazeera offers comprehensive coverage of Middle Eastern politics, global conflicts, and perspectives from the Global South, and is broadcast to the Persian Gulf region.
